Like the Müller Thurgau, our Kerner grows at an altitude of almost 900m above sea level in one of the highest vineyards in South Tyrol. The German cross between Trollinger and Riesling, named after the Swabian poet Justinus Kerner, produces racy and spicy wines with a discreet nutmeg note.

Handpicked, cold maceration for 12h, gentle pressing, alcoholic fermentation in stainless steel, 6 months storage on fine lees.



This powerful white wine shows a straw yellow color with green reflexes, a complex bouquet of lime, peaches and hints of mango and has a wonderful mouth fill and structure without missing the acidity that gives him the freshness in the aftertaste. A very complex and versatile wine that can be paired to many dishes.
